



## **Ethics in Public Administration international project**

### **Multilateral meeting in Lisbon, March 2013**

In the initial part of the multilateral meeting, participants were presented the Portuguese national part of the research study.

Subsequently, each partner informed about the current state of his/her national report, especially the research on vocational training for civil service employees in prevention of corruption. The Czech partner conducted the research and disposes of outputs from six analysed courses. The Polish partner is currently processing the analysis in the similar approach. Both the German and Portuguese partner have conducted a survey among their national institutions of public administration about the practice of anti-corruption training. The survey was carried out by sending out a questionnaire, previously prepared by partners. The questionnaire also covers the questions intended to evaluate the impact of training. The results are to disposal in a preliminary form and will be completed subsequently. Each national report should mention if good practices were identified, according to the criteria previously agreed. Good practices will be then analysed by the Czech partner researchers and they will try to conclude them.

In the next part of the first day of the meeting, there were discussed a schedule of remaining works and meetings. The set of meeting will be finalized in June at the occasion of International Days organized by the German partner Hochschule für Wirtschaft und Recht Berlin.

The second day of the meeting was launched by the presentation given by Ms. Isabel Corte Real, former Secretary of State for the Administrative Modernization, who provided an insight to the ethics in public administration in Portuguese as well as European context.

Partners also derived the idea from the previous meeting regarding the publication of the research study.

In compliance with the previous arrangement, the research study will be released in the limited amount on CDs so as all partners have the same number of copies to disposal. Simultaneously, the study is to be uploaded on the website of each partner. Partners will decide then on their own about a further form of publication (national language versions, printed publication) and number of copies.
